•lowa: You have until <u>December 31, 2022</u> to complete all eighteen (18) hours of continuing education or retake the test.

There is no grace period.

Cost: NIEC Member companies' employees - \$100.00 per person per class

Non-member companies' employees - \$110.00 per person per class

Continuing Education Credit: Each class has been approved by the Nebraska State Electrical Board and by the Iowa Electrical Examining Board for <u>six hours of continuing education credit in the code</u>. These hours will also be accepted in South Dakota, Minnesota, and Wisconsin. Certificates will be mailed to each participant shortly after the class.

Class Registration: To register for any of our online classes, go to https://MyElectrical.Training/. On that site you can select classes, register, and pay for your classes.

<u>All classes count as CODE HOURS</u>. In each state, you are required to take a *minimum* of six hours in the NEC, but you *may take all* of your hours in the NEC. You may take any class more than once and get full credit.

Maximum Enrollment: Each seminar has a maximum enrollment of 100 people. As long as the enrollment website lets you complete the registration process, space remains in the class.

All classes for this term will be taught online by Fred Bender.

As of now, we will not hold any in-person classes thru the end of 2020.

Using the Online Software:

To register for any of our classes go to our new website: https://MyElectrical.Training/

If you've participated in a **Zoom** meeting with friends or family, our software is similar, but significantly more sophisticated so that we comply with the rules for online training in various states. Per state rules, our software will record your participation in the class. The recording software will capture you sitting in front of your computer and will also record what is on your computer screen.

If you have **already paid** for a class in 2020, you will be able to transfer that money to our online classes.

There are a few **technical details** for you to know and for which you can plan:

- A Desktop or Laptop computer with an Integrated or External camera. You cannot use a tablet or a cell phone. A headset is preferred, but not required. You will be able to ask questions of the instructor as the class progresses. There can only be one person per computer.
- You must have a **Google Account** to login a GMAIL account will work. You don't have to use it for anything else if you don't want to, but you must have that account to access the class software. A GMAIL account is free and you can sign up for one here if you don't already have one: https://support.google.com/mail/answer/56256?hl=en
- The software is built using Google technology, so we strongly recommend that you use the **Chrome browser** on either an Apple or a Windows device. You can download the browser for free here: https://www.google.com/chrome/
- You will need a **high-speed internet connection** since this is transmitted video. If you stream movies on any of the typical sources (Netflix, Amazon, etc.), you are all set.
- There will be breaks during the day as well as a meal break.
